### The advantages of a bilingual education.

We are very proud of the bilingual education offered here at Ysgol Eifionydd. International research has proven that bilingual people tend to be more successful in schools and colleges and are flexible thinkers. Bilingual people in Wales will earn between 8% and 10% more in salaries each year compared with people who speak only one language. There is a growing need for bilingual people across many areas of work in Wales and Gwynedd.
