Pupils were given a valuable opportunity to design, build and code models using the LEGO Spike Prime kit, developing creativity, problem-solving skills and computational thinking. The workshop provided a practical and relevant experience of modern technology, inspiring pupils to see how STEM is applied in the real world and raising awareness of higher education and



future careers in the field.







Year 8 Educational Visit - Railway 200, Llandudno

Recently, **Year 8** pupils had a valuable opportunity to visit the **Railway 200 Exhibition Train** at **Llandudno Station** as part of cross-curricular work between the **History** and **Science departments**. During the interactive experience, pupils explored the development of the railways over the past 200 years, linking their learning about the Industrial Revolution with scientific concepts such as engineering, design, energy and technological development.

Pupils also took part in practical **STEM activities** and discussed how scientific innovation has influenced society and modern transport. The visit provided an excellent opportunity to see clear links between curriculum subjects and real-world STEM careers, strengthening pupils' understanding and enthusiasm for learning.

Angori *i*-Ragori (Anchoring to Excellence) is a **whole-school approach** that supports pupils in **striving for excellence** by focusing on learning processes, higher-order thinking skills, and self-regulation. The approach is embedded within tracking, review, and reporting systems, enabling pupils to understand their progress and take ownership of their learning journey.

i-Lywio, **i Lwyddo** (*Navigate to Succeed*) is a flexible, optional, whole-school **enrichment programme** available to all pupils. It empowers pupils to plan and manage their own learning, choose approaches that work for them, and pursue opportunities that broaden the curriculum and deepen understanding. We look forward to embedding these processes further across the school, continuing to develop a culture of ambition, ownership, and independent learning.









Clwb Cymru

Ysgol Eifionydd's **Clwb Cymru** was established this year with the aim of **promoting Welsh identity** and creating a space for pupils to communicate and socialise through the medium of Welsh. The first meeting was held on **Tuesday 14 October**, welcoming **Siân Eurig**, **Secondary Language Strategy Coordinator**, to celebrate **Shwmae Su'mae Day** and to discuss the benefits of bilingualism and language practices.

As part of the celebrations, Year 7 pupils took part in a Greetings Hunt around the school, learning different ways to greet others in Welsh. In addition, Year 9 Welsh Second Language pupils shared "Support the Language" posters in local shops, encouraging the community to start conversations in Welsh. This is a positive and inspiring initiative that strengthens the use of Welsh within the school and the wider community.

The Behaviour Code: The Way Forward

A new **Behaviour Code** has been introduced at **Ysgol Eifionydd** following consultation with **staff**, **parents/carers**, **and pupils**, ensuring that everyone's voice was included in the process. The aim of the code is to ensure consistency across the school, reflect a positive ethos, and provide all pupils with a clear understanding of expectations. The code is based on three core principles, **The Way Forward: Be Ready**, **Be Respectful**, **and Be Safe**. In addition, new classroom referral steps have been introduced, along with an updated referral and monitoring system to support positive behaviour. This work was supported by specialist training from **Steve Baker**, who continues to work with the school to further strengthen and develop provision.
