

What does the course offer me?

Encourage students to:

- Actively engage in the study of Leisure and Tourism to develop as effective and independent learners and as critical and reflective thinkers with enquiring minds.
- Understand the nature of the Leisure and Tourism industry.
- Develop the understanding of the contribution that leisure and tourism makes to society.
- Develop awareness that health and safety issues are integral to leisure and tourism.
- Develop an awareness and understanding of sustainable development and environmental issues.
- Appreciate diversity and recognise similarities and differences in attitudes and cultures in societies.
- Develop their opportunities for progression into employment in the Leisure and Tourism industries or higher level qualifications in these related sectors.

How will I learn?

- Written tasks.
- Visits to Leisure and Tourism locations.
- Group and individual presentations.
- Group and individual research.

How will I be assessed?

The qualification consists of 2 units.

Unit 1 – Investigating Leisure and Tourism Provisions in a chosen area.

Controlled Assessment – A choice of broad prescribed tasks which should be completed in 8 – 10 supervised hours. (60%)

Unit 2 – Leisure and Tourism destinations.

Written Paper (1 hour and 30 minutes).

Section A - A series of compulsory short answer questions.

Section B – A series of compulsory short answers and extended writing based on case studies. (40%)
